HELP US KEEP COUCLOS SING OUT OF THE SEWER SYSTEM WHAT IS F.O.G.?

F.O.G. is Fats, Oils, and Grease and is found in food and food ingredients such as: meat, butter, cooking oils, mayonnaise, salad dressings, gravies, and food scraps.



HELP US BUST SOME OF THE COMMON MYTHS CONCERNING F.O.G.

It's ok to pour **F.O.G.** down the drain as long as I use the garbage disposal.

The garbage disposal only grinds up **F.O.G.** and food items before passing them into your sewer pipes. These items can still cause the system to back-up.

It's ok to pour **F.O.G.**down the drain as long as
I run hot water...

The **F.O.G.** will cool and build up in the sewer pipes causing the system to back up.

It's ok to pour **F.O.G.** down the drain as long as I chase it down with dish soap...

Soap breaks up **F.O.G.**, but the soap will lose its effectiveness, causing the grease to solidify in the sewer pipes.

HELP US BY FOLLOWING THESE STEPS

- 1. After cooking food that contains F.O.G., let the F.O.G. cool to a safe temperature.
- 2. Put the F.O.C. into a disposable, container (e.g. an empty soup can) and dispose of the container in the trash.
- 3. Scrape food scraps from the dishes into the trash can. Use a paper towel to wipe F.O.C. out of the pots and pans before washing them.
- 4. Use sink strainers to catch food waste during dish washing. Empty the strainer in the trash can.
- 5. Soak up spilled F.O.C. with an absorbent material such as paper towels or kitty litter and throw it into your trash can.
